Women's Leadership Conference: A Success

On Saturday, February 22, over 100 students participated in Colgate's Fifth Annual Women's Leadership Conference, entitled "Women Making Change." Keynote speaker Wendy Kaminer discussed the conflicts and changes in the women's movement, and panel presenters and workshops en-couraged student leaders to make change. Lunch-time round-table discussions were a favorite part of the day. Students led discussions on sexuality, diversity and feminism at Colgate. The success of the conference was due to the strong contribuions of staff members and volunteers at the Center for Women's Studies. "Women Making Change" was covered by both the Maroon News and The Hamilton Tribune.

Marcia Ann Gillespie, Editor-In-Chief of Ms. Magazine, will visit Colgate on Tuesday, April 8th. Ms. Gillespie will be talking about "Racism and Sexism" at 8:00 pm in the ALANA Cultural Center. A life long activist in the struggle for many social reforms, Gillespie has sought to incorporate her activism into her writing and publications. As Editor-In-Chief of Ms., Gillespie provides direction and leadership to a magazine which is considered to be the major feminist pub-lication in the country and is the most widely read publication of its kind in the world. It maintains an advertisingfree format so as not to be constrained by the limits of corporate sponsorship. Ms. Gillespie is an African-American feminist who believes that feminism means a willingness to grapple with issues of race, class, disability, age and sexual difference, both within and outside the movement.
